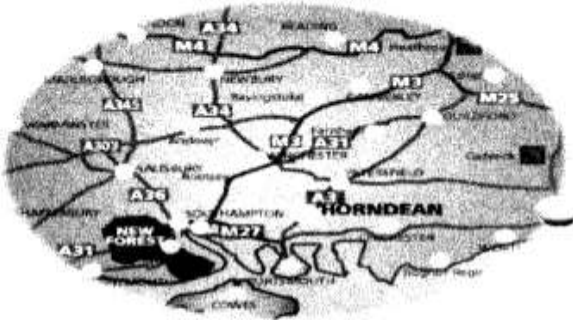

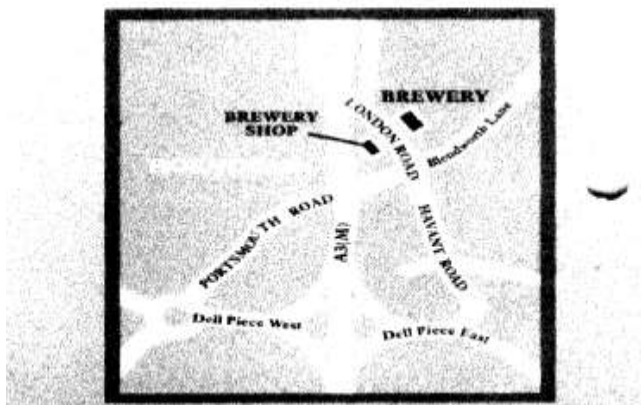

Cooch Memorial Lecture “20 million Therms under the Sea” by Ken Reid, Asset Commercial Manager Transco, at the Worthing Library Lecture Theatre, on Friday, 24th November, 2001 at 2.30 p.m.

This presentation will describe the technical, operational and commercial arrangements, which have enabled natural gas to flow for the first time between the UK and the European mainland via the sub-sea gas pipeline that connects Bacton in Norfolk and Zeebrugge in Belgium.

The author will describe the challenges involved in this project from a UK perspective and how they were overcome. He will also highlight the implications for the UK gas

industry, which has been forever changed by this important connection in Europe, and the diverse gas market it encompasses.
